On November 15, 1965, Governor Dan Moore, with the advice and consent of the Council of State, summoned the General Assembly to convene in extra session. The purpose of this session was to consider recommendations proposed by the Commission to Study the Statutes Relating to Visiting Speakers at State Supported Educational Institutions. This commission was popularly referred to as the "Speaker Ban Law Study Commission," and additional material on the Commission is available in the Archives in a separate record group of that name.

In the face of an injunction from the United States District Court, Middle District of North Carolina, Governor Moore again summoned an extra session of the General Assembly to convene January 10, 1966, for the purpose of state legislative and Congressional redistricting and reapportionment.

When Lieutenant Governor Robert W. Scott opened his campaign headquarters in the Sir Walter Hotel in the fall of 1967, his opponents for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination were Raleigh attorney J. Melville Broughton, Jr., and Negro dentist Reginald Hawkins of Charlotte. In the primary election held 4 May 1968, Scott led the ticket but did not receive a majority of the votes, giving Broughton the right to call for a runoff. Broughton, however, withdrew from the race and pledged his support to Scott. Scott was elected Governor in the general election of 5 November 1968. His major opponent was Republican candidate James Gardner of Rocky Mount.

Campaign materials transferred from "Bob Scott for Governor" headquarters consist of correspondence, memos, speeches, weekly schedules, notebooks and lists of supporters [some begun by Scott's father, Governor (and later U. S. Senator) W. Kerr Scott], campaign literature, 60-second radio spots, and visitors' registers.

Campaign correspondence, arranged by county, includes pledges of support, letters suggesting governmental improvements, mailing lists, information regarding rallies, photographs, requests for campaign literature, invitations, newspaper clippings, lists of Country Squires, letters and telegrams of congratulations, and letters thanking supporters.


