Physical Description: 3.5 linear feet of newspaper clippings, transcripts, notes, genealogies, scrapbooks, wills, deeds, correspondence, memoranda, etc.

Acquisition: Logged for microfilming by Mrs. Albert Timothy Outlaw of Kenansville, May, 1974.

Description: Albert Timothy Outlaw (1894-1962), born in Albertson Township, Duplin County, son of John H. and Winifred Outlaw; educated in public schools; assistant register of deeds, 1910 until 1932 when he was elected register of deeds, a post he filled until poor health forced his retirement in 1952. Mr. Outlaw also served as ex-officio clerk of the board of county commissioners, county tax supervisor (1925), member county board of elections (1926), secretary of county Democratic convention. A compiler of genealogical data and local history, he delivered the historical address at the bicentennial celebration of the Grove Presbyterian Church in 1926. In 1932 he married Carolyn Peden Garrison of Greenville, South Carolina; the couple had two children, Sarah West and A. T. Jr.

Except for 70 original manuscripts, this collection consists principally of typescripts, manuscripts, news clippings, and scrapbooks of biographies of outstanding Duplin County men and of events in the county's history of interest to posterity. There are also compilations and notes on the genealogy of Duplin County families. In spite of extensive weeding of duplicates throughout the collection, the researcher will be confronted with still more duplications, especially in the scrap-books. Arrangement on the microfilm follows the order of the following description.

(P. 149.1) ORIGINAL RECORDS, 1746-1936, n.d.

Pre-Revolutionary Period (1746-1775), 16 items: Includes 9 deeds (Grantor-Grantee: Glover, Price, Drake, Herring, Sullivan, Jones, Whitfield, Parish, Walker, Blizzard, Cade, Outlaw, Beverly, Williams, Houston, Johnston, Logan, Clark) and 3 wills (Edward Outlaw, 1759; John Clark, 1767; Thomas Hicks, 1775).

Late Eighteenth Century (1780-1798), 12 items: Includes tax list, Captain Kenan's Company (fragment, 100 names), 1783; estates papers (John New, 1780; Roger Smith, 1795; Jacob Kornegay, 1798); pocket memorandum book (fragment), (Frederick Gaddy, ca. 1786); surveys (Kedar Bryan, 1788, and Joseph Kornegay, 1798); commission, justices of the peace (Watkins, Teachy, Lanier), 1794; road agreement, Kornegay's Bridge to Golden Grove Bridge, 1787; power of attorney to John Dickson, 1784.

Antebellum Period (1840-1857), 10 items: Including deed for 1 acre for \$1.00, William Outlaw to trustees of Washington Female Academy, 1848; division of Negroes, estate of Henry Houston, 1841; records concerning trust funds for education of poor children of Duplin County, estates of Peter Carleton, 1859, and Alexander Dickson, 1857.

Miscellaneous items (1863-1936, n.d.), 7 items: Including letter from Grady Outlaw to William Outlaw, Company D, 27th Regiment, concerning conditions in Duplin county in January, 1863; mortgage; deed from A. T. Outlaw and wife to George W. Whitfield, 1936; recipe for treatment of burns, n.d.
