HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION: Mrs. Spivey is daughter of G. F. Taylor and H. W.
"Pop" Taylor is his nephew. G. F. Taylor went to UNC 1901-1902, taught school
in Holiness Church near Rose Hill, Duplin County, went to Falcon, Cumberland
County, and became principal of Falcon Holiness School, 1907-1916. He
moved to Franklin Springs, Georgia, in 1918 or 1919, and became editor of
the Advocate and president of Emmanuel College, both connected with the
Pentacostal Holiness Church. Items include:
