Physical Description: Twelve (12) 2 ¾ x 4 ½ black and white (snapshot) photographic prints

Acquisition: Ms. Edith V. Jenkins, 6016 Francis Marion Road, Effingham, South Carolina 29541-7802, donated the photographs to the South Carolina State Department of Archives and History who donated them to the North Carolina State Archives on April 17, 2000. The collection was accessioned in April, 2000.

Description: The photographs belonged to L. T. Fulmer of South Carolina who worked at CCC Camp #426 at Ravensford in eastern Swain County in western North Carolina in the 1930s. The images show buildings, tents, individuals, and scenic views near Sylva, Waynesville, and the Great Smokey Mountain National Park.
