**Description:** Papers of the related families of Eborn and Davison of Washington and Beaufort counties. Davison letters (1809-1822) are primarily to Mary Davison in Washington County from her brother Robert of Washington, N.C., about yellow fever there (1810), his trading ventures, and visit to New York (1816). Eborn family letters (1835-1899) include plans of William C. Eborn to raise mulberry trees in Beaufort County (1839), home remedies, claims to inheritances in England and Germany (1886-1899), and revival meetings in Martin County (1897). There are originals, copies, and abstracts of Beaufort and Hyde county grants and deeds (1705-1842); estate papers (1847-1852) of Elizabeth Davison Eborn; slave bills of sale; and rent receipts (1821-1822) for building used by slave as a barber shop. Also genealogical material relating to the Eborn, Davison, Cutler, and Waddell families.
